- This group will help move 319 projects along & WV Rivers is also offering a Source Water Protection Community program, similar to Tree City USA where the city completes certain tasks & projects and gets designated a Source Water Protection Community

Back Creek

- Restorations are still undergoing permitting, but our Stream Team from the Watershed division has been working on budgets to get ready for job showings. Still hopeful we will get started by late spring.
- Looks like we may need to hire someone to perform an archaeological survey for both sites to satisfy requirements from the State Historic Preservation Office be on the lookout for more info on that.
- BCFPB just completed inspections of 2 easements that EPCD helped fund the purchase of through the Back Creek 319 grant program. Halbert and Krebeck/Musselman. Both properties looked fine, & I can share the monitoring reports with anyone that is interested.

Sleepy Creek

Been busy mostly with the 3 tree plantings, which will be discussed further in the agenda.

Watershed Committee

- It was discussed at the committee meeting that there is a lot of interest in local stream issues, monitoring of streams, how streams get listed for impairment, how they are eligible for funding, etc. We proposed that it would be helpful to have a Watershed Committee meeting after the WGG to address these issues, and we thought it would be good if all supervisors could attend so they can discuss concerns with streams in their own counties and be informed about stream issues going on that they might not be aware of.
